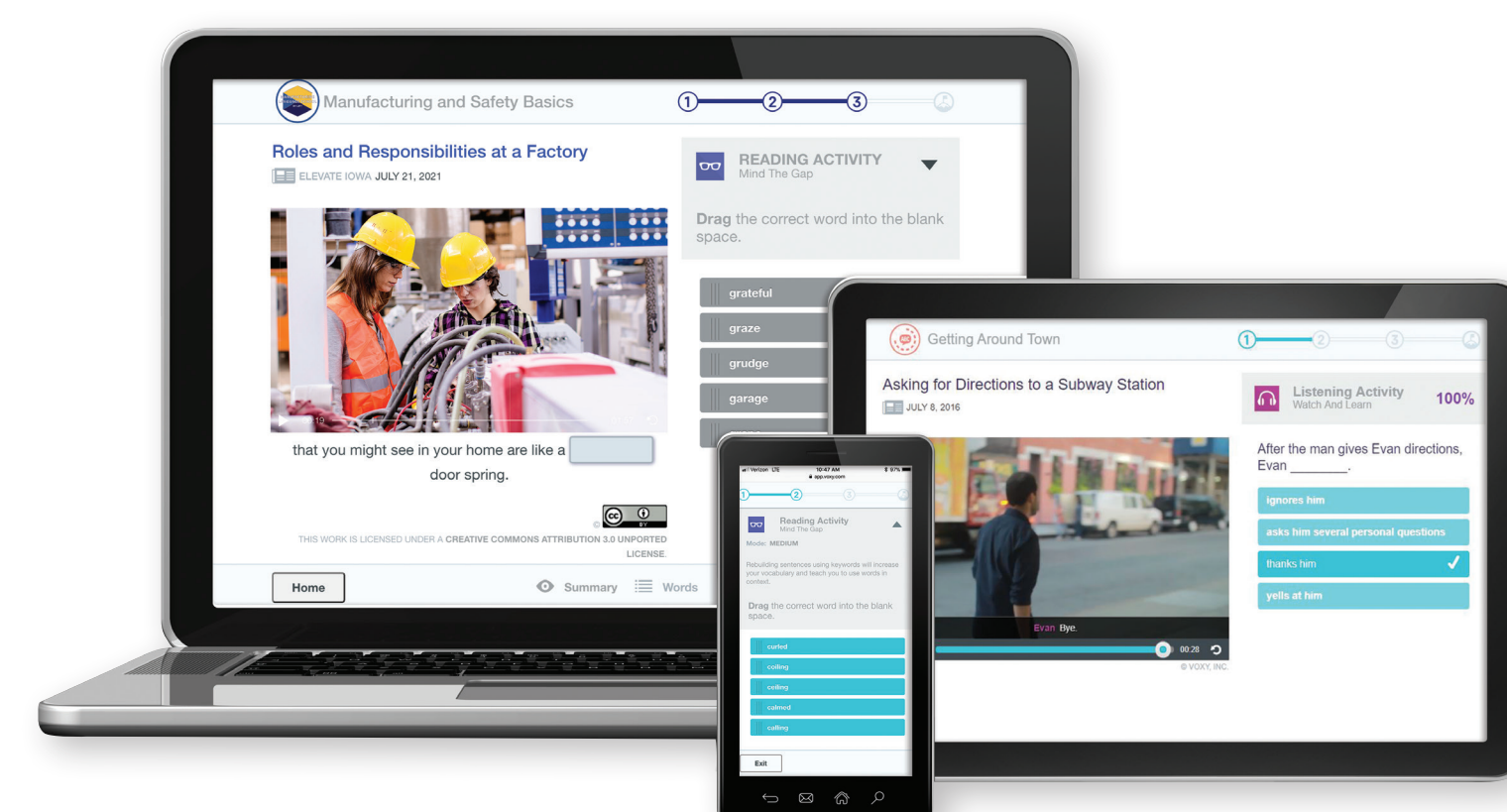
From Sewing to Social Impact
